Frequently Asked Questions

1. What are the key dates for the Learning for Teaching Module?

Please be aware that if you are hoping to undertake your placement in June - July, you are advised to complete your DBS application ASAP.

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1. How many hours of placement do I need to do?

EDU2016 (L5) - 15 credits – 25 Hours
EDU2017 (L5) - 30 credits – 50 Hours
EDU3013 (L6) - 15 credits – 25 Hours
EDU3014 (L6) - 30 credits – 50 Hours

You can choose to undertake either a face to face placement in a school, or the virtual placement which uses video resources and online materials. For the virtual placement, you won't be linked to a particular school.

2. What are the dates that I can undertake “virtual placement”?

The “virtual placement” materials will be available on ELE. It is up to you how you organise your work during Term 1, as all of the learning is asynchronous. Some students might decide to have a “placement week” and complete the materials in a focused, shorter period; others might decide to spread the placement activities over the term. Students from this year's cohort have valued this flexibility.

3. How many days of school placement do I need to do?

You have the opportunity to complete a face-to-face school placement instead of a ‘virtual’ placement.

EDU2016 (L5) -15 credits – 5 days
EDU2017 (L5) - 30 credits – 10 days
EDU3013 (L6) - 15 credits – 5 days
EDU3014 (L6) - 30 credits – 10 days

4. What are the dates that I can undertake my school placement?

Please check these carefully.

- 20th-25th June, 27th June-1st July, 4th-8th July, 11th-15th July 2022.
- 5th-9th September, 12th-16th September, 19th-23rd September 2022.

5. Do I arrange my own placement?

Yes. We will advise you about how to do this.

6. Can I arrange my own placements in/near Exeter?

Yes.

7. Can I use this module to retrospectively accredit prior school experience, which I have independently arranged?

No.

8. Will the university pay travel expenses?

No.

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9. Can I arrange my placement at a school that I used to attend, or where friends/relatives attend/teach

Yes. That said, you might learn more in a school that you have NOT attended, and this would allow you to contrast your placement school with school(s) you already know. The decision is for you to make, and some students do find it easier to get a placement in a school that already knows them.

10. Can I arrange a placement in an Independent School?

We recommend that you arrange a placement in a state funded school. The experience will strengthen an application for a teacher-training course. However, some students may want to spend time in an Independent School, for example if they already have lots of state school experience. You can arrange an Independent school, but we would generally recommend state schools.

11. Can I undertake a placement outside of the UK?

No. If you are an international student we can advise you on obtaining a UK placement

12. I am doing the 30 credit module and I would like to do a week in primary and a week in secondary, is this possible?

Yes, and it's a good idea to try both if you're uncertain about which you would prefer

13. Does a Learning for Teaching module provide a teaching qualification?

No, but it can be helpful in securing a place on a post graduate teacher training course

14. What do I do if I am unable to attend my placement due to illness/family emergency?

If this happens prior to the placement, please notify your placement school and contact learningforteaching@exeter.ac.uk for advice on how to complete your placement days.

15. I need further assistance completing my DBS form

16. Will the university pay the DBS Fee?

Yes, we will pay the basic fee, but not for the updating service. If you expect to undertake other work or voluntary work with young or vulnerable people over the next few years, you might find it worthwhile to pay for the updating service yourself. This currently costs £13 / year, but you must apply for the first year within 14 days of your certificate issue date. 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17. I have had a DBS check recently, can I use that?

No, you must have a new one so that it is verified by the University.

The exceptions are:

- if you have already had a DBS check through the university,
- or have already paid for the DBS Update Service when you had a DBS check NOT through the university, then please inform us, as you may not need another form.

18. Are there any special requirements for International Students, or UK students who have lived abroad, wishing to take a Learning for Teaching module?

Only one, which is that you will need a UK DBS declaration **AND** an equivalent Police Check from your country of residence: the DBS office can advise you about this.
